

# Tajweed Lesson 02:

## AL-MADD AL-ARID LISSUKOON

This madd only occurs when we stop or make a pause in our recitation

When we pause we must do so on a saakin (non-vowel)

If we have a letter of madd before this pause then it will be called AL-MADD AL-ARID LISSUKOON

This madd can be elongated two, four or six harakahs and the choice must be adhered to

مَالِكِ يَوْمِ الدِّينِ

و

(وَفِرْعَوْنَ ذِي الْأَوْتَادِ)

و

هُمُ الْمُفْلِحُونَ

# • AL-MADD AL-LEEN

This is a special madd and also only occurs when we stop or pause

if the stop is preceded by a letter of leen then the same ruling applies here as it did in arid lissukoon

What is a letter of leen?

There are two letters of leen and they are a waw saakinah with a fathah before it and a yaa saakinah with a fathah before it

فَلْيَعْبُدُوا رَبَّ هَذَا الْبَيْتِ

وَأَمَنَهُمْ مِّنْ خَوْفٍ

رِحْلَةُ الشُّتَاءِ وَالصَّيْفِ

فَرَيْتِي

تَيْتِي
